It is generally assumed that this year's Conservative Party conference - which begins on 18 September - will conclude with the withdrawal of the UK's four Trident nuclear deterrent submarines and the termination of the Faslane Base nuclear facility in Scotland, which is the home to HMS Victorious and the two Vanguard-class submarines, HMS Clyde and HMS Hermes. However, it is far from certain that such a proposal is likely to be included in the Queen's Speech on 9 September as Prime Minister Boris Johnson had promised Theresa May in an interview earlier this year. The party has recently disclosed that it would seek the savings it needs from a future UK withdrawal from the EU to allow the Ministry of Defence to "plug the gap" created by a Trident cutback, but this won't be achieved by making cuts to departments other than defence. As the proposed budget for the Ministry of Defence this year is £15.6bn, it would seem to suggest that Trident is likely to be axed. Here, a committee of MPs - The Independent Parliamentary Committee on Defence - discuss the prospects and implications of a UK Trident cutback. As the UK's nuclear deterrent is based in Scotland and the people in the area are acutely aware of the role it played in the preservation of the country in the Second World War, the conclusions of the committee may be of interest. The chair of the committee is veteran Tory MP Tom Clarke. He is not a supporter of a Trident cut
